DAILY AWAKENING PRAYER:

Pray that God would grant many people in our city and in our nation to come to the saving knowledge of Christ.

That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him. — Eph. 1:17

MONDAY: Missions – Gift for Christ and the Ignite Conference

- Pray for many that attended the conference will enter into full-time mission work and be sent from Living Hope to make disciples among unreached people groups.
- Pray for our partners who traveled to be with us to be encouraged and renewed in their calling to reach their particular people group with the Gospel of Jesus.

TUESDAY: Pregnancy Center and Counseling Center

WEDNESDAY: Continued Revival in Living Hope

Focus your prayer around: **2 Corinthians 5:20** “Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.”

Pray: Father, Living Hope bears Your name. We are Your representatives in this world. We have dishonored You and Your name through our indifference, unconcern, and lack of holiness. How can You bear allowing us to continue as we are? Have mercy on us, O God! Grant revival to us that we might live lives worthy for Your name's sake.

THURSDAY: A need in our city, nation, or world

Pray for God to heal those sick with COVID and remove this plague from our land.

- Pray for people who are sick to be healed.
- Pray for people to remain well.
- Pray for schools and businesses to remain open.
- Pray for this plague to be lifted from us.
- Pray for Biblical churches to thrive and remain focused on making disciples.

FRIDAY: Pray Living Hope (LH) will impact our homes, our neighbors, and every generation with the hope of Jesus.

Ask God to bless LH to join God in sharing the Gospel in this season of celebrating the fact that the Light of God has come to vanquish darkness and bring salvation to the world.

- Pray for our homes to be filled with hope in Christ and to focus on Jesus during this Christmas season and not focus on our circumstances and what we desire to be different.
- Pray for LH members to reach out to their neighbors in meaningful ways and help them to know Jesus and to engage in worship with us at LH.
- Pray for the Next Generation in our city to know the hope we have in Jesus and for hundreds of students to become faithful disciples of Jesus.
- Pray for LH worship gatherings to honor God and encourage the saints in this season of celebration.

SATURDAY: Pray for our worship gathering

This Sunday we begin a new series focused on Christmas: **See the Light!**

Title: The Light Has Come | Text: Matthew 4:15-16

Main Thrust: The region of Zebulun and Naphtali had experienced turmoil and had longed for liberation. They were first to see the great light of God’s deliverance in Jesus. We are living in a time of turmoil in our broken world. The coming of Jesus reminds us that we have been liberated to live for a greater cause and a Kingdom of Light that has come and is coming.

- Challenge people to live in the light and to share the light of Jesus.
- Encourage people to know God understands our circumstance and has a plan for the turmoil we are in and so we can know that there is reason to have hope.
- Teach people how to live in the light of Jesus.
- Help people understand the meaning of, “the light has come,” and how it is we are to live because the light of God has come into the world.
